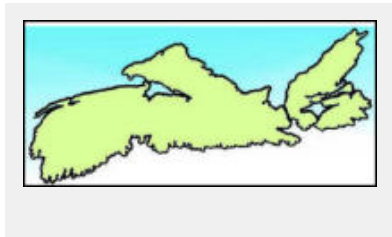

Natural Resources Minister John MacDonell will attend a tour for staff, students and VIPs on Friday morning.

The open house for the public will be Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Visitors can participate in demonstrations, staffed exhibits and self-guided tours.

LUNENBURG — You can step back in time in Lunenburg this weekend and discover the first indoor bathroom in town and a rum hidey-hole as the Lunenburg Heritage Society holds its annual house tour.

The tour of seven homes and heritage business will be held Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. The cost is \$25 and includes refreshments at St. John's Parish Hall, costumed guides, musicians and a grand prize draw.

Visitors will also be able to see the only waterfront fish company that maintains a direct link to its origins in the 1800s, and may even experience the spirit of a venerable old lady who refuses to leave her home.

RCMP are looking for a man who exposed himself to a woman and her young daughter on an Upper Tantallon trail.

The woman and her eight-year-old daughter were walking on a bridge that passes over Hammonds Plains Road near Fox Hollow Drive at about 6:30 p.m. Tuesday.

A man rode past them on a bicycle and yelled out a request for the time. When the woman turned around, the man exposed himself to her and rode off, RCMP said.

The man is described as five-foot-seven, slender build, brown hair, a beard and wearing soccer shorts.

### **Man charged in stabbing stays in jail**

BRIDGEWATER (CP) — A man facing nine charges including attempted murder will remain behind bars until his next court appearance Oct. 7.

The charges against Cory Kyle Langille, 22, of Bridgewater include two counts of attempted murder and two of aggravated assault.

A pair of early-morning stabbings in Bridgewater on June 29, 2008, sent two people to hospital in serious condition.

A Canada-wide warrant was issued for Langille. Bridgewater police arrested him Aug. 21 in Calgary.
